

Announcing Penn State Schuylkill's 30+ Program

What is the 30+ program?

This \$1,000 lifetime award was developed to financially assist new Penn State adult learners.

What are the requirements?

- ✓ Students must be at least 30 years of age
- ✓ A completed Penn State Admissions Application must be on file
- ✓ A completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) application must be on file

Are there any restrictions?

- ✓ \$1,000 lifetime award for NEW students
- ✓ Awards are not available to Penn State employees or their dependents
- ✓ The maximum award limit is \$250 for students receiving 100% tuition reimbursement from their employer
- ✓ Only available to undergraduates
- ✓ Course selection is limited by seat availability; the University reserves the right to cancel any course because of insufficient enrollment or for any other valid reason.

How much is my award per credit?

3 credits = \$250
6 credits = \$500
9 credits = \$750
12 or more credits = \$1,000



How do I apply for student aid?

Here are 3 easy steps to applying for financial aid assistance.

1. Complete a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

- ✓ Required to determine eligibility for loans, grants, scholarships, and Federal Work-Study Program
- ✓ Apply online at www.fafsa.ed.gov
- ✓ Federal School Code (indicate on FAFSA): Penn State 003329
- ✓ Recommended dates are:
Freshman..... February 15
Returning Students..... April 15

2. Receive Award Notification Information

- ✓ Information from the Office of Student Aid which informs you about student aid that you may be eligible to receive.

3. Complete PHEAA (PA Higher Education Assistance Agency) Grant Status Notification Letter

- ✓ Provide information to complete your grant record
- ✓ Expect your PHEAA award letter after May 15 (PA residents only)
